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# 2021 CoC Competition Application Debrief

## <u>Summary –</u>

- This meeting's CoC Competition Application Debrief will cover projects, funds, and opportunities, with a second presentation in the February or March meeting. The following points were made during the debrief:
  - The CoC competition closed in November
  - The application allocated \$28 million in funding for renewal projects, and \$3 million in funding for new projects
  - o Specific funding announcements will be communicated by February, or by the first quarter
  - Most funding went to PSH programs
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Three application rounds were held for new project funding
  - o Provider capacity challenges include the pandemic, and the related need to use up current COVID funding

## HOME ARP:

## Summary –

HOME American Rescue Plan has awarded Detroit 16 million in funding new or rehabbed PSH units to address chronic homelessness, with 3 million also earmarked for leveraging existing supportive services. There is additionally a NOFA for one congregate shelter to de-congregate. \$665,000 will go towards staff capacity, 3 million for admin staff to work with the Housing and Revitalization Department. Since there will be funding for improving shelter environments, this opportunity is different than previous grants.
