# HIC & PIT: Overview

- HUD requires CoCs to conduct a bed inventory and sheltered count of the entire homeless system each year in January.
  - This year's PIT Count was held January 25<sup>th</sup>
- Every two years, the Detroit CoC is required by HUD to conduct a count of unsheltered persons experiencing homelessness in Detroit, Hamtramck, and Highland Park.
  - Will continue in 2024 – Unsheltered PIT Count
- Began PIT/HIC related work in Winter 2022
- Submitted to the HUD HDX April 2023

# Sheltered PIT Count

- The Sheltered Point-in-Time count (PIT) provides a snapshot of the number of people who were experiencing homelessness in our community on this one night. This includes persons experiencing homelessness who are in Emergency Shelter, Safe Havens, and Transitional Housing programs.
- The report provides a detailed overview of the various sections including Household Populations and Demographics included in the PIT count and separated by multiple subpopulations including Veteran, Unaccompanied Youth, and Parenting Youth Households.
- The report also provides additional subpopulation information on adults only, these subpopulations include persons experiencing Serious Mental Illness, Substance Use Disorder, HIV/AIDS, and Persons fleeing Domestic Violence.

**1280 people experienced homelessness in the cities of Detroit, Hamtramck, and Highland Park on the night of January 25<sup>th</sup>**





# Sheltered Count Analysis

## **Increasing factor**

- 5 Outreach Hotel/Motel programs added (seasonal)

## **Decreasing factors**

- HCV vouchers availability continued and pulled at a significant rate
- Both DV and Youth beds were under utilized
- Large percentage of CERA Hotel/Motel Beds went offline

# PIT Count Analysis – Project Type

## ES Count - Decrease (-16%) (-209)

- 2022: 1279 persons
- 2023: 1070 persons

## SH Count - Increase (19%) (+3)

- 2022: 16 persons
- 2023: 19 persons

## TH Count - Decrease (-2%) (-3)

- 2022: 194 persons
- 2023: 191 persons

## Overall Count - Decrease (-14%) (-209)

- 2022: 1489 persons
- 2023: 1280 persons

# PIT Count Analysis – Special Populations

## Serious Mental Illness (+15%)(+34)

- 2022: 229 persons
- 2023: 263 persons

## Substance Use Disorder (-40%)(-34)

- 2022: 85 persons
- 2023: 51 persons


## HIV/AIDS (+114%)(+8)

- 2022: 7 persons
- 2023: 15 persons

## Fleeing DV (+8%)(+9)

- 2022: 111 persons
- 2023: 120 persons

# PIT Challenges

- *Timely* Data Input & Updates
- Confirmed Counts *Changing* Post-Confirmation
- Data Quality Missing/Errors
  - Income/ Annual Assessment
  - Disability
  - DV
- Solution:
  - Continued implementation and revision of Quarterly Audit to streamline data quality issues.

# 2023 HIC – Utilization by Project Type

Across all bed types, **97%** were occupied on 1/25/23

**89%** of emergency shelter beds were filled

**80%** transitional housing beds were filled

**54%** of safe-haven beds were filled

**100%** of RRH beds were filled

**100%** of PSH beds were filled

**100%** of OPH beds were filled

# 2023 HIC – Project Mix

107 Projects were reported in the 2023 HIC

**43** Permanent Supportive Housing Projects reported  
3,866 beds

**28** Emergency Shelters reported 1,144  
beds; **54** Overflow Beds (EHA & Hotel/Motel)

**14** Transitional Housing Projects reported **234** beds

**18** Rapid Rehousing Projects reported **738** beds

**3** Safe Haven Projects reported **35** beds

**1** OPH (EHV) Program reported **245** beds

# 2023 HIC – Population Specific

**39** projects designated a total of **2,225** beds for the Chronically Homeless

**11** projects designated a total of **315** beds for Youth

**19** projects designated a total of **886** beds for Veterans

**5** projects designated a total of **79** beds for Survivors of DV

**1** project designated a total of **14** beds for Persons with HIV/AIDS

# HIC Challenges

- Limitations to Data
  - ES, TH, RRH & PSH - Data Entry occurring during PIT/HIC clean –up period is very challenging
    - Duplicate clients being served in multiple programs but can only be counted in one program for HIC.
- Possible Solutions:
  - Improved Quarterly Data Quality Exercise
    - B& U Review added
  - 2024 elements added to renewal application
    - Timely HIC Data Entry/Quality


