# Two Long-time Homeless Men Attain Housing and New Starts in Life

June 7th, 2021

Willie Brown has many compelling tales to tell. Of a glorious past. Then a fall from grace that left him homeless for two decades, including sleeping in a tent through bitter Detroit winters.

He tells of being a Marine veteran. Of singing background vocals for the legendary funk band Slave. Willie says he's related to the great Sam Cooke and then croons his own soulful rendition of You Send Me. He tells of boxing professionally. Of making good money from fighting and singing, and then losing it all through bad financial decisions and alcoholism.

"I lost my home to foreclosure in the mid-80s, and then started living on the streets, in different shelters, in vacant houses and abandoned cars, wherever I could find temporarily," said Willie, who is now 63. "I put myself through hell and hit rock bottom. I didn't care, didn't trust people, and didn't have anything. I just wanted to be left alone."

# Stimulus Payment & Child Tax Credit

\*If you haven't received a previous stimulus payment, you may be eligible for a *Recovery Rebate Credit*. To claim the rebate, you must file a 2020 tax return. Details are available *here*.

#### **Funeral Assistance**

If you paid for funeral expenses after January 20, 2020, for an individual whose death may have been caused or likely the result of COVID-19 you can apply for up to \$9,000 for funeral assistance.

Case Management Coordinator (Detroit – House of Hope)

The Case Management Coordinator is responsible for providing comprehensive assessment, planning, implementation and overall evaluation of individual and program needs. They will draw upon youth strengths to inform service planning, advocate on behalf of youth, collaborate with other service providers and manage crisis situations as needed. And will provide administrative support to programs by maintaining comprehensive youth files, conducting data-entry and completing required documentation.

# Laptop-to-Go Program

Those with a valid Detroit Public Library (DPL) card can check out a laptop for free.

- Reserve a laptop in person at any open <u>DPL</u> <u>location</u> or by phone;
- ID and library card will be verified at pickup;
- Must be checked out on an adult card;
- Not accepted: restricted, digital, or other MILibraryCard library cards;
- Checkout period is 90 days, with an option for a 1 time renewal;
- Must renew in person with the laptop
- Laptop has Wi-Fi capabilities, but not built-in Wi-Fi service;
- Replacement fee is \$500;
- Apply for a library card <u>here</u>. To complete registration, visit a DPL location.

## **Emergency Broadband Assistance**

The Emergency Broadband Benefit Program is an Federal Communications Commission (FCC) program that provides a temporary discount on monthly broadband bills for qualifying low-income households. Eligible households receive:

- Up to a \$50/month discount on broadband service and associated equipment rentals
- Up to a \$75/month discount if household on qualifying Tribal lands
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, tablet, or desktop computer (with a co-payment of more than \$10 but less than \$50)
