COVID-19 Testing Results

Reporting Period [3.23.2020 - 5.14.2020]

Below is data on the COVID-19 test results for homeless persons in the city of Detroit.

578 Tests Conducted

90 Total Positives

Of the tests administered:

34% have been completed by hospitals

12% have been completed by Wayne State University

88% have been completed by the **Detroit Health Department**

As of May 15, 2020 - there are a total of **13 guests** at the Alternative Shelter Sites [also referred to as Isolation Shelter Sites].

60% of referrals to these Alternative Shelter Sites have come from **hospitals 40%** from our **traditional shelters and outreach providers**

New Homelessness Response Actions Taken

Increased Hygiene Resources for Unsheltered Persons

A collaborative initiative to increase access to restrooms, handwashing stations, and showers for unsheltered populations has resulted in the following:

- Street Medicine Detroit has placed field handwashing stations in locations of need
- The City of Detroit is placing portable toilets with hand sanitizer in parks identified by outreach teams (please note these will be available later in the day on Friday 5/15)
- Certain nonprofits in the community are allowing access to existing bathrooms (e.g. NOAH Project) or providing portable toilets, showers, etc. (Pope Francis Center)

This google map shares the current locations of all available sites. Many sites are available 24/7, but the linked map will specify hours of operation if availability is limited (see availability when you click on each point). This map will continue to be updated as additional locations are added.

Telehealth

The City has secured resources from the Jacob Family Foundation to be able to increase nurse screening utilizing telehealth technology.

Bonus Pay for Frontline Shelter Staff

United Way and Quicken Loans have donated funds to provide bonus pay for frontline at 19 emergency shelters. These shelters will be contacted by the City of Detroit next week with additional information.

Client Incentives

Other communities have employed the use of incentives to help ensure that clients wait to receive their COVID-19 test results and to to ensure that clients remain at their isolation site(s) for the full quarantine period. Detroit is working to develop an incentive structure for clients in our system modeled after this work in other communities. Private funds will be used to provide the incentives.

Reporting Period [3.23 - 5.14.2020]

The Coordinated Assessment Model (CAM) is Detroit's coordinated entry system to homeless services. During the COVID-19 pandemic, CAM is operating a phone-based model. Any individual or family without a safe place to stay for the night can contact CAM at 313-484-4449, seven days a week from 7am-8:30pm for assistance.

Additionally, CAM is coordinating transportation to alternative shelters from emergency shelters and hospitals for people who are homeless and also are 1) experiencing COVID-19 symptoms; 2) awaiting COVID-19 test results; or 3) have tested positive for COVID-19.

Important Updates

The state-wide Eviction Moratorium has been extended

- As of last night, May 14, Governor Whitmer extended the statewide eviction moratorium through June 11, 2020. The executive order temporarily extends protections for tenants and mobile home owners from being evicted from their home during the continuing COVID-19 pandemic.
